Insurance Message

IT TAKES MORE THAN MONEY

Most commodities can be bought provided you 1) have the money, 2) can find a willing seller, and 3) can agree on a satisfactory price. In like manner, most investments -real estate, stocks, bonds, mutual funds, bank accounts -require only an arm's length agreement and a deal is struck. All it takes is money.

There is one notable exception to the above statements: The purchase of life insurance. Other hazards may prevent you from qualifying - occupation, character, even old age. What would happen if you suddenly woke up and decided to buy life insurance, but had lost your ability to qualify for it? Ever think about that?

I can tell you about our guarantee purchase option. Think of that! The ability to secure additional insurance, depending on the amount of your option, on a guarantee basis - without necessarily being in good health. This option can be added at issue of a new certificate up through age 37. Find out at your convenience how little it costs to guarantee the right to increase your protection.

THREE BROTHER KNIGHTS WHO WILL BE CANONIZED AS SAINTS¹

VENERABLE MONSIGNOR NELSON HENRY BAKER, SERVANT OF GOD, [1841-1936] the beloved "Apostle of Charity"

BLESSED ANDRE BESSETTE -1845 - 1937 Born into a poor family in Montreal. Given name was Alfred Bessette. Entered the Congregation of Holy Cross in Montreal and was given the religious name Brother Andre. Was responsible for the construction of the Oratory of Saint Joseph on Mount Royal, Montreal. Feast: January 6 (United States)

VENERABLE FATHER MICHAEL J. MCGIVNEY, SERVANT OF GOD, born in Waterbury on August 12, 1852. August 14, 1890, Father Michael J. McGivney died at the age of 38.

- They were born within an eleven-year period: 1841 to 1852.
- They are brother Knights of Columbus:
 1. Father McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882.
 2. Monsignor Baker and Brother Andre were Knights of Columbus.
 3. Monsignor Baker and Brother Andre have active K of C councils named after them. ;
- All three justifiably can be called "Apostles of Charity".
- All three understood poverty personally and had great compassion for the poor and the sick.
- All three ministered to working people and their families-
- They were concerned for widows and orphans.

- All three were workingmen in their own right-
- They lived and died practically in our "backyard", each one of them less than a day's drive from Hilton. (Lackawanna, Montreal and Connecticut)
- Both Father Baker and Father McGivney attended Our Lady of Angels Seminary, attached to Niagara University in Niagara Falls, New York, during a two-year period around 1869 -1871.
- Father Baker was ordained in 1876 and Father McGivney in 1877.
- Alfred Bessette entered the novitiate of the Congregation of Holy Cross in 1870 and was professed into the order in 1872, as Brother André-
- All chose a religious vocation at about the same time, 1868-1870.

WARDEN

The warden is responsible for supervising and maintaining all council property, except that which belongs to the financial secretary.
